Fry's on Line Ordering

We all know Fry's and I am sure we all have purchased items there. Now whether you get a good deal or not is usually in the eye of the purchaser but there is one way you can save when buying there. Sometimes the price on their web site is considerably lower than in the store. A case in point, I looked up the price of an Olympus xD picture card (2 GB) for my new camera (details later) and found the M+ card for \$24.99. Imagine my surprise when I went to the store and found the item tagged at \$39.99! I mentioned this to the young lady in the department and she immediately turned over her computer to me and told me to order it on line but with store pickup. I did this and went to the check out line and they produced the card for \$24.99 (plus tax). It was a painless operation and the lady was very helpful. She advised me that frequently items are cheaper on line than in store but they will honor the on line price even for in store pickup. This is worth knowing and I recommend you check for items before you go to the store and jot down the on line price. If it's cheaper on line order it in store for store delivery. I saved 37.5%, not to be sneezed at! Beware however some items on the web site are not available for store pickup.

Magnigraph.com

If the above isn't enough try <http://www.magnigraph.com/> a free site you can create your own magnigraphs of your signature, a sketch, even a photograph. Your magnigraph can then be scaled to arbitrary size, for printing on T-shirts, mugs, or posters. Makes a great gift!



There are two ways you can create your own magnigraphs. You can upload an image from your computer, or you can point at an image on the web. Low resolution, high contrast images work best. Free Photo Viewer

View photos and EXIF tags with this free photo viewer. This light-weight photo viewer allows you to view photos and easily examine EXIF parameters of each shot such as aperture, shutter speed, ISO value, camera model, focal length, time and date, flash settings, etc. IPTC comments are also supported and displayed. The program has settings for optimizing its performance on slow CPUs. View JPEG and RAW files faster on laptops or old computers. You might recognize this picture from the world famous Museum of Modern Art in Little Hale, (population 52) near Sleaford, Lincolnshire in England.

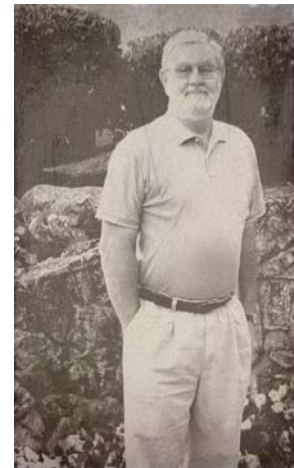
Making a Picture Old

Photo Recovery

Easy Photo Recovery priced at \$29.95 downloadable at <http://www.easyphotorecovery.com> described by the distributors as follows:

Adobe Premier Elements

As most of you are aware Adobe has a very good program for editing video files called Premier. They also make an easier version called Premier Elements which is very popular. Several members I know take videos and it has been suggested we incorporate Premier Elements into the Photoshop Elements SIG. I think this is a good idea, the two programs are complimentary and even if you don't have a video camera most digital still cameras have movie capabilities. I suggest we talk about this at the next meeting and hopefully can set up an agenda.

Adobe Photoshop Elements 7

The shoe finally dropped, after a couple of months of speculation Adobe finally announced the latest version of Elements is scheduled for release September 27th 2008 according to a blurb I just received from Adobe. The price is pretty much the same as for Elements 6 about \$100 for the full version, \$80 for the upgrade, with free shipping if you order on the Adobe web site now. Amazon is advertising the full version for \$74 after a \$20 mail in rebate and of course there is no sales tax or shipping. I am sure deals will emerge but I think the pricing is pretty much as expected.

Adobe is offering the combo pack of Photoshop Elements 7 and Premier Elements 7 (see previous story) for \$119, upgrade price. Again I think some retailers will be offering deals but initially nothing earth shaking.

A word about upgrade versions, they are the same as the full version it is just you are saying you own a previous version of the software and deserve a discount.

The main thing is the new version worth investing your money in when you have version 6 or maybe 5? I haven't seen the software obviously so I am not sure exactly what has been improved or added in version 7 over version 6 but I am expecting a copy of the software by the end of the month so I will probably be able to show it at the October SIG meeting.

Adobe have launched an on line photo storage and slide show creating service called Photoshop.com which is free for the basic tools or \$49.99 per year for the deluxe version. Below are the improvements in Elements 7 over Elements 6 shown under "Software benefits".
